Some are regarded as being influenced by Buddhist ideas, even if in a diluted or distorted way, such as Groundhog Day (1993), The Big Lebowski (1998), Fight Club (1999), The Matrix (1999), American Beauty (1999), I Heart Huckabees (2004), and the first two trilogies of Star Wars.
